

Management of Second Stage of Labour in Low Risk Women at Term - Endorsed for Use in Clinical Practice Policy

1. Purpose

The WA Country Health Service (WACHS) endorses relevant policies from other WA Health Service Providers and organisations external to the WA health system for use in clinical practice. This endorsed policy document is from Women and Newborn Health Service (WNHS), King Edward Memorial Hospital (KEMH).


2. Policy

A flowchart for the management of second stage of labour in low risk pregnant women has been developed for WACHS context of practice. The variation relates specifically to the:

- WNHS <u>Clinical Practice Guideline Second stage of labour and Birth</u>
- WNHS <u>Clinical Practice Guideline Second stage of labour management of delay</u>

Care is person-centred and includes informed choice, consent, privacy, respectful communication, and contemporaneous documentation.

2.1 Management of second stage of labour in WACHS



LEVEL 2 Service

Obstetric Consult required and arrange transfer at <u>one hour total</u> of passive or active second stage with no urge to push or minimal evidence of flexion /rotation / descent

CTG Monitoring Required

- Any FHR abnormality on intermittent auscultation
- Apply at **two hours total** (Nullipara) and **one hour total** (Multipara)
- Any abnormal CTG requires medical review and consideration of expedition of birth (it is not normal for a CTG to be abnormal in 2nd stage)

Always source current documents from <u>WACHS HealthPoint Policies</u>. Copies sourced otherwise are considered uncontrolled.

3. Roles and Responsibilities

WACHS Safety and Quality Executive Committee are responsible for acting as the principal endorsement authority for external organisations' clinical policy documents.

WACHS Area and Regional Medical, Nurse and Midwife Directors are responsible for participating in the review for appropriateness of external organisations' clinical policy and guideline documents for use by clinicians within the WACHS.

All staff are required to work within their scope of practice and policies and guidelines to make sure that WACHS is a safe, equitable and positive place to be.

4. Monitoring and Evaluation

5. Compliance

This policy is a mandatory requirement under the *Health Services Act 2016*.

Failure to comply with this policy may constitute a breach of the WA Health Code of Conduct (Code). The Code is part of the <u>Integrity Policy Framework</u> issued pursuant to Section 26 of the <u>Health Services Act 2016</u> and is binding on all WACHS staff which for this purpose includes trainees, students, volunteers, researchers, contractors for service (including all visiting health professionals and agency staff) and persons delivering training or education within WACHS.

EUCP policies are designed to provide staff with evidence-based recommendations to support appropriate actions in specific settings and circumstances. In the clinical context, where a patient's management should vary from an endorsed WACHS policy, this variation and the clinical opinion as to reasons for variation must be documented in accordance with the <u>Documentation Clinical Practice Standard</u>.
