Suture and Staple Removal Addendum

Refer to: WACHS Wound Management Policy

Effective: 11 March 2022

Equipment required

Sterile dressing pack Sterile metal, fine, non-toothed, serrated dressing forceps

Sodium Chloride 0.9% Sterile stitch cutter or staple remover Sterile adhesive dressing if required PPE: gloves, safety glasses

Disposal receptacle Sharps container

Prepare equipment and patient

- Perform hand hygiene and don/change PPE at all appropriate moments throughout procedure.
- Ensure to use an **aseptic technique** throughout procedure:
 - 1. Explain procedure to patient and confirm consent to proceed.
 - 2. Consider analgesia needs prior to procedure. If indicated and available, administer as per WACHS Medication Prescribing and Administration Policy
 - 3. Prepare equipment. Remove dressing if in place.
 - 4. Cleanse and dry wound using an aseptic technique.

Suture and Staple Removal

- If wound begins to dehisce after removal of alternate sutures or staples, then cease procedure and redress as appropriate. Inform Medical Officer/ Senior Clinician.
- Sutures/staples to be removed from healed wounds as directed by MO.
- Remove alternate sutures/staples first, even if full suture removal is ordered.

Suture (Interrupted) Removal

- Gently grasp the knot of the suture with forceps and raise it slightly.
- Place the curved tip of the suture cutter underneath the knot, as close to the skin as possible.
- Gently cut the suture and pull out with forceps.
- Ensure exposed suture material is not pulled through the wound.
- Place removed suture onto gauze.
- Inspect removed suture to ensure all material is removed.

Staple Removal

- Place both claws of the lower jaw. of the remover under the centre of the staple.
- Squeeze the handle to completely close the device, bend the staple, and pull the edges out of the skin.
- Gently move the staple away from the incision site, when both ends of the staple are visible.
- Relax pressure on handles to release staple either: onto gauze or into sharps container.

If wound edges remain approximated:

- Cleanse and dry incision line, apply appropriate dressing if required.
- Dispose of waste into appropriate containers.
- Remove PPE and perform hand hygiene.

Document suture/staple removal in patient health record.

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
