



John Flynn Prevocational Doctor Program

Funded by the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care, the John Flynn Prevocational Doctor Program (JFPDP) offers 10–11 week rural primary care rotations to eligible WA Country Health Service (WACHS) prevocational junior doctors.

Where can I go?*

Collie River Valley Medical Centre

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Bunbury Regional Hospital
 GP placement providing full exposure to rural general practice including emergency medicine, obstetrics, anaesthetics, skin surgery and occupational health.

Panaceum Medical

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Geraldton Health Campus
 GP placement providing a well-rounded experience and understanding of multidisciplinary team-based coordination of care.

Health by Nurture

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Bunbury Regional Hospital
 GP placement with heavy focus on women’s health, providing exposure to antenatal, intrapartum and postpartum management.

Pioneer Health Albany - General Practice

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Albany Health Campus
 Multiple well-supported GP placements operating in a co-consulting model with exposure to a wide variety of medicine in a rural general practice setting.

Kimberley Aboriginal Medical Service

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Broome Health Campus
 Aboriginal Medical Service in Broome and remote Aboriginal community clinics in Bidadanga, Beagle Bay, Balgo, Billiluna and Mulan including primary renal care in Kimberley Renal Service.

Pioneer Health Albany - Women’s Health

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Albany Health Campus
 GP placement focusing on women’s health providing exposure to childbirth, antenatal and postnatal care.

Kimberley Aboriginal Medical Service and Royal Flying Doctor Service

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Broome Health Campus
 Aboriginal Medical Service in Broome and remote Aboriginal community clinics in Bidadanga, Beagle Bay, Yakanarra, Fitzroy Valley and remote stations on the Gibb River Road.

South West Aboriginal Medical Service

Available to eligible WACHS doctors at Bunbury Regional Hospital
 Aboriginal Medical Service in Bunbury and outreach clinics in Brunswick, Busselton, Collie, Eaton, Harvey, Manjimup, Katanning and Narrogin.

**As the program expands, rotations may be offered in other rural and remote locations.*

How can I apply?

To participate in the JFPDP, you must be:

- An Australian citizen or permanent resident; and
- A WACHS employed prevocational junior doctor in postgraduate year 1-5.

There is no separate application process, just express your interest in a JFPDP rotation in the term preference form sent to you by your local WACHS Medical Education/Admin team.
