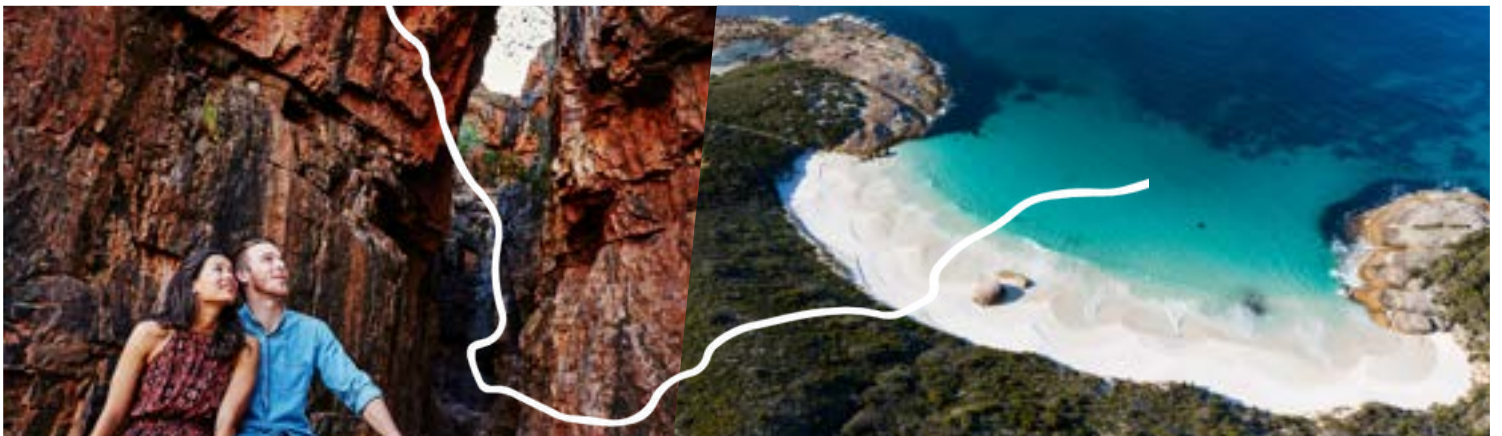

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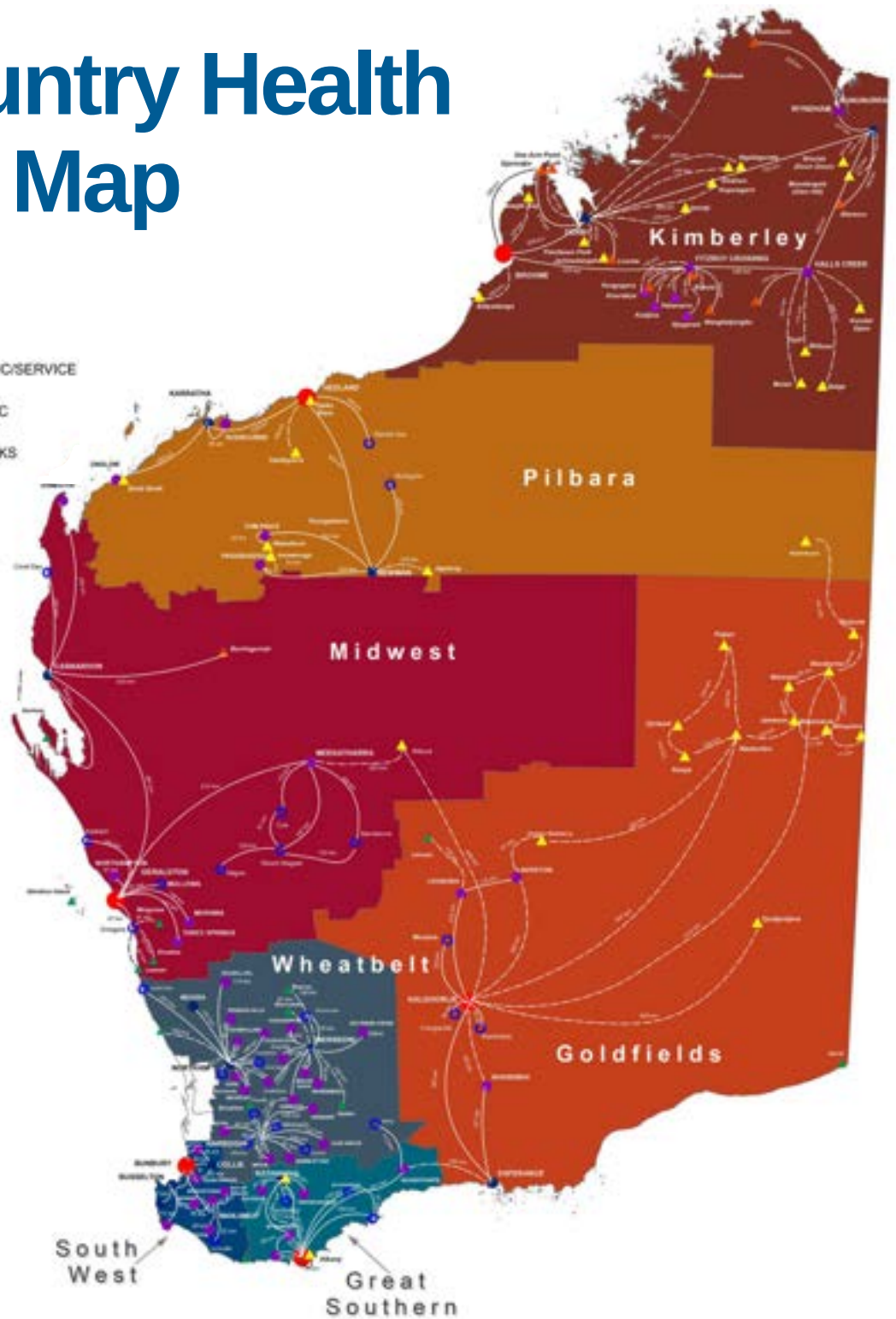
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WA Country Health Service Map

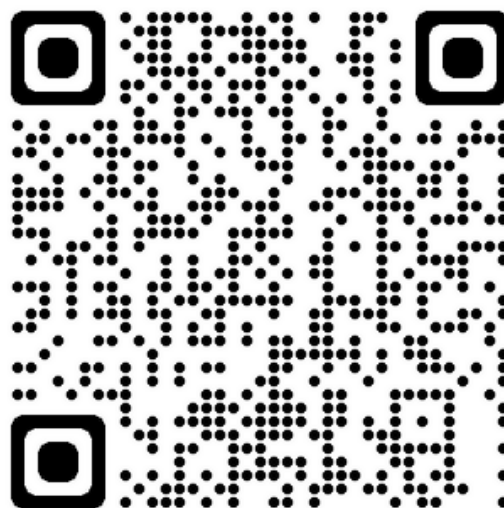

The successful candidates will be responsible for the clinical care of general medicine patients at the Albany Health Campus under the supervision of experienced physician consultants. One role will be primarily responsible for managing an inpatient team including managing inpatient referrals to general medicine. The other role will be primarily responsible for managing outpatients including fast track outpatient referrals, general medicine clinics, Hospital in the Home and hospital avoidance strategies. The successful candidates will be responsible for the clinical care of general medicine patients at the Albany Health Campus under the supervision of experienced physician consultants.

The Service Registrar roles deliver high quality, continuously improving, patient-centred care within well supported, Physician-led, general medicine training teams. The roles are accredited for General Practice, ACRRM, Intensive Care and RACP Basic trainees who are seeking broad exposure to diversity of acute undifferentiated presentations in medicine and longitudinal care with Hospital in the Home and medical outpatient services. The role is focussed on managing inpatients, hospital in the home, hospital avoidance and general medicine outpatient clinics.

The Service Registrars also manage a team of junior medical staff and work collaboratively as part of a multidisciplinary team. There is a strong focus on teaching as well as opportunities for research and quality improvement activities, with allocated non-clinical time.

The position requires participation in the acute undifferentiated on-call roster, with after-hours responsibilities approximately weekly. Applications for 6 or 12 months will be considered.

General Medicine Advanced Trainee, Broome

These positions provide a fantastic opportunity to gain extensive experience in Rural, Remote and Indigenous medicine. You will work with a team of experienced, passionate physicians providing care to patients with complex comorbidities throughout the Kimberley. You will treat rheumatic heart disease, autoimmune diseases and some infectious diseases rarely encountered elsewhere. Our general medical clinics provide exposure to a broad range of subspecialties, while you will also attend dedicated Hepatitis / HIV, Respiratory and Diabetes clinics, and Immunology and Haematology case conferences. You will have the opportunity to work with visiting subspecialists (Cardiology, Rheumatology, Nephrology). Although based in Broome, you will provide outpatient clinics and inpatient support throughout the Kimberley region in hospitals, remote community clinics and Aboriginal Health Services.

The successful applicant will hold current registration as a medical practitioner with Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency and be eligible for Advanced Training in General Medicine in 2023 (including successful completion of RACP Part 1 and Part 2 exams). The successful candidates will be responsible for the clinical care of general medicine patients at the Bunbury Hospital under the supervision of experienced physician consultants.

The role will be rotated between two Advanced Trainees with one responsible for inpatient activities and the other role will be primarily responsible for managing outpatients including rapid review outpatient referrals and general medicine clinics.

You will participate in the on-call roster approximately once weekly overseeing the review and admission of acute undifferentiated patients admitted to general medicine through the Emergency Department. The role involves supervising and supporting Basic Trainees and RMOs in the ED. Bunbury Hospital is co-located with a private hospital and contracted service providers on Bunbury Health Campus.

The campus provides access to a wide range of services including diagnostic radiology and radiation therapy, comprehensive cancer services, nephrology, palliative care, psychiatry, coronary care and coronary angiography, intensive care and a wide range of surgical services. The environment provides exposure to a wide range of clinical conditions. There are many opportunities to attend educational sessions and to educate and mentor junior doctors and to support the Medical Education Unit.

Advanced trainees are expected to participate in hospital quality improvement activities including clinical audit and antimicrobial stewardship working closely with consultant physicians.

There are opportunities to participate in research and complete your College research project requirements.

General Medicine Service, Bunbury

The successful applicant will also be required to work with consultants in the delivery of efficient, safe and cost-conscious patient care and to participate in educational activities and quality improvement initiatives.

The Day Procedures and Theatres area provide consultant surgical and anaesthetic services for the specialties of general surgery, obstetrics and gynaecology, ophthalmology, urology, orthopaedics, plastics, ENT, emergency and trauma.

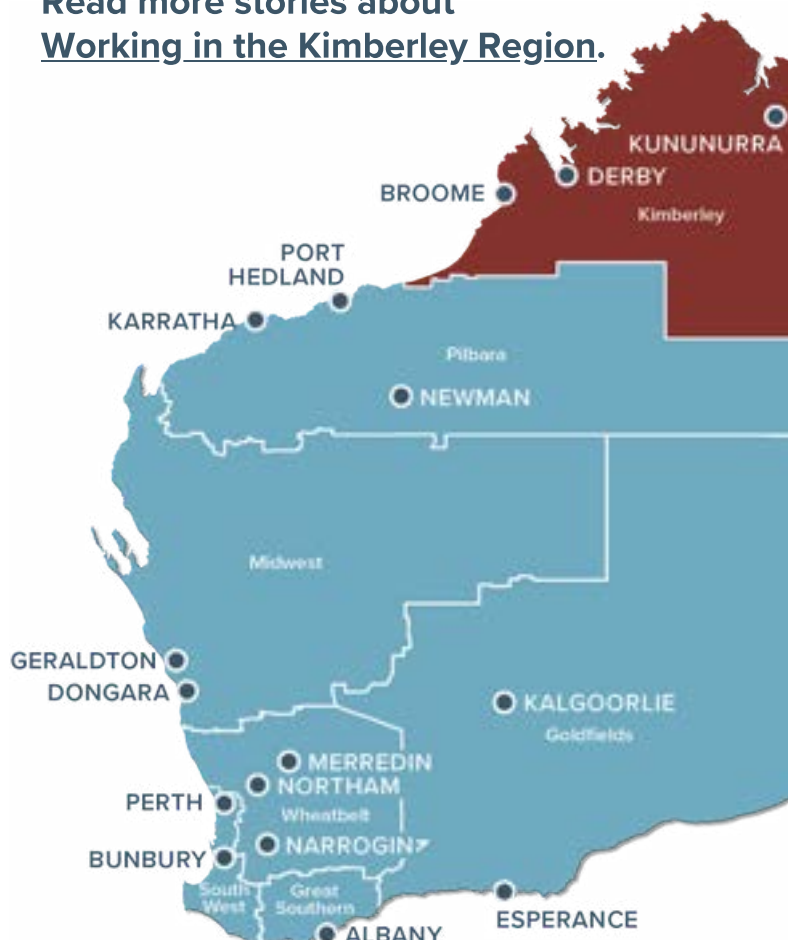

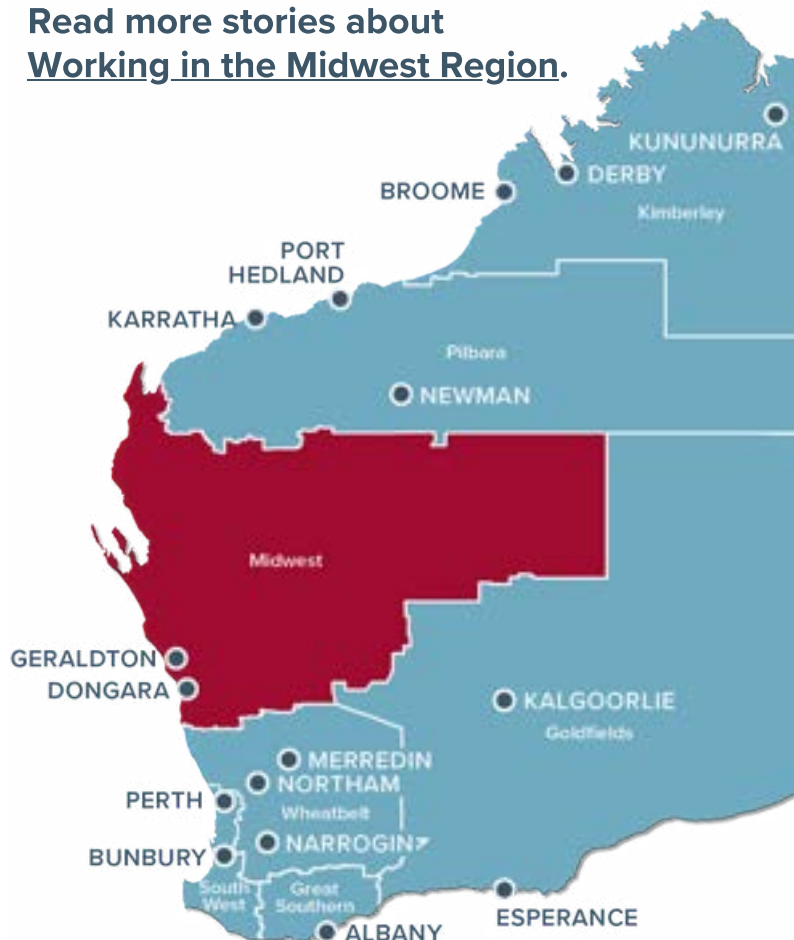
