You will provide a high quality of clinical service to all hospital patients under the supervision of clinical supervisors including Registrars, Consultants and other senior staff within a multidisciplinary team. You will work within your ability and according to the hospital's core values and will be able to expand your knowledge and skills through the available learning opportunities. Suitable applicants will be able to demonstrate clinical and procedural experience as a registered medical practitioner for a minimum of 6 months in a hospital setting in Australia, or comparable country.

Broome Health Campus serves one of the State's leading tourist destinations. Broome Health Campus is the regional resource centre for the Kimberley and resident and specialist medical staff provides health care services to hospitals, community and remote sites across the region. The hospital has undergone an eight-year redevelopment providing North-West resident's access to a high quality, modern health service to match the Kimberley region's growing demands. The major upgrade includes new operation theatres, consulting rooms for visiting specialists, a public dental surgery, refurbished maternity unit and an expanded \$10.4 million Emergency Department which has more than doubled to 15 acute bays. The campus is also now equipped with the latest specialist equipment and provides a modern and purpose-built environment for patients to receive high quality care. Broome Health Campus provides specialist care in General Medicine, General Surgery, Paediatric, Psychiatry, Obstetrics/Gynaecology along with Rural Generalist Terms and is supported by other visiting specialists. A Paediatric Unit and Psychiatric Unit at Broome Health Campus opened in 2012.
