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Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. Clinical

- 1.1. Provides clinical management of Emergency Medicine patients as per Australian Triage Standards and National Emergency Access Targets requirements.
- 1.2. Leads, supervises, coordinates and manages the care of patients with life threatening conditions, including multiple trauma.
- 1.3. Participates fully in the doctors' roster, including on-call after-hours duties.
- 1.4. Provides clinical services as determined appropriate for a 24hr emergency service, including telephone or video-conference consultations and advice to WA Country Health staff in other hospitals.
- 1.5. Maintains quality patient medical records in accordance with health service protocols.
- 1.6. Promptly writes discharge summaries for inpatients under their care.
- 1.7. Responsible for a portfolio as directed by Operations Manager and Director Medical Services.

2. Clinical Administration

- 2.1. Ensures the ongoing application of continuous quality improvement principles in systematically evaluating and meeting customer needs.
- 2.2. Ensures compliance with relevant standards, legislation and regulatory requirements.
- 2.3. Liaises with members of the health care team and the private sector to meet the needs of patients under their care and maintain a customer-focused approach.
- 2.4. Chairs and participates in governance-led departmental and doctors' committee meetings as required, such as Medical Advisory Committee meetings.
- 2.5. Actively participates in service development activities eg, Medical Emergency Team, Medical Emergency Response, Hospital In The Home etc.
- 2.6. Attends to medico-legal issues that arise concerning patients that have been under their care and advises the Medical Administrator about complaints received, pertaining to themselves or other doctors in the hospital.

3. Mandatory Education

- 3.1. Supervises junior medical staff, including the assessment of staff performance in relation to clinical competence, adherence to departmental protocols, timely and accurate documentation, communication with patients, relatives, peers, other staff and doctors in other hospitals and in the community.
- 3.2. Participates in professional continuing educational activities, regular performance review and provides evidence of maintaining current knowledge and skills.
- 3.3. Participates in post-graduate and under-graduate training programs for junior medical staff, trainees and medical students.
- 3.4. Supervises, guides and teaches nursing, allied health and other support staff as appropriate.
- 3.5. Participates in departmental academic activities and mandatory essential training and skills.

4. Leadership

- 4.1. Demonstrates professional standards and ethics as appropriate to the seniority and leadership role of clinical staff and according to WA Country Health Service Code of Conduct.
- 4.2. Demonstrates excellence in interpersonal skills when dealing with patients, colleagues, nursing, allied health and support staff.
- 4.3. Participates in WA Country Health Service South West Disaster planning, strategy and practices.
- 4.4. Participates in clinical research where appropriate and active promotion of research activities wherever possible.

5. Other

5.1. Other duties as required.

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Work Related Requirements

The following criteria are to be read together with the Brief Summary of Duties and considered in the context of the WACHS Values.

Essential

- 1. Eligible for registration by the Medical Board of Australia.
- 2. Fellowship of the Australasian College for Emergency Medicine or equivalent.
- 3. Possess substantial postgraduate medical experience in general medicine, emergency medicine and hospital practice.
- 4. Demonstrated commitment to continuing education.
- 5. High level of communication and interpersonal skills.
- 6. Experience in rural area medicine.
- 7. Demonstrated experience in health IT design, reform and/or implementation.
- 8. Demonstrated commitment to the effective management of clinical risk and improving quality.
- 9. Current knowledge of legislative and regulatory requirements in the areas of Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety & Health, and how these impact on employment, people management and service delivery.
- 10. Eligible for / or in possession of a current C or C-A Class drivers licence.

Desirable

- 1. Experience or qualifications in other specialist or procedural fields.
- 2. Substantial experience in emergency medicine research including study design, implementation, evaluation, presentation and publication.
- 3. Demonstrated participation and skills in medical education at all levels and across multiple disciplines, in particular FACEM Part 1 and 2.
- 4. Demonstrated experience and ability to foster strong relationships between general practice, emergency medicine and other stakeholders.
