

Communiqué WA Country Health Service Board

This communiqué highlights key discussions from the WA Country Health Service (WACHS) Board's regional engagement meetings in the Great Southern region.

27 - 28 February 2020

The first regional engagement visit for the Board for 2020 kicked off in the Great Southern region where meetings and forums were held in Albany, Denmark, and Mount Barker.

The Board had the opportunity to tour Albany Health Campus again, meeting Acting Regional Director Jan Cook and local staff to inspect newly constructed and up-and-coming facilities on campus grounds.

The Board visited the Mental Health Step Up Step Down service, operated by Neami National, to see first-hand how the service is improving options for people with mental health issues in the Great Southern region. There was also an opportunity to walk through the Albany Community Hospice, where invaluable inpatient palliative care services are delivered, and the Albany Cancer Accommodation, which provides patients and their escorts with comfortable motel style accommodation during their cancer treatments at Albany Health Campus. Board Members were able to view where the specialised radiation oncology bunker, known as the Linac Suite, will be constructed in order to deliver oncology services closer to home for Great Southern patients.

The Board travelled to Denmark Health Service, the residential aged care facility Blue Wren Lodge, and to Mount Barker to visit the Plantagenet Cranbrook Health Service. At both facilities, Board members had the opportunity to talk with local staff members and hear about important local issues.

Staff engagement sessions were also held at Albany Health Campus and at the WACHS Great Southern regional head office. Board Members heard about notable WACHS Great Southern initiatives including the 2019 Pitch You Pilot winner 'Memory Clinic', Best Medication practices and the Penicillin Allergy Project. The Great Southern region also participates in daily Safety Huddles, and the Board were able to observe sites across the region dialing in and participating in the 10 minute briefing session.

The sessions were also an opportunity for the Board to inform local stakeholders and staff of the WACHS Strategic Plan 2019 – 2024 and key issues for the local health services and community groups.

The Board would like to acknowledge and thank staff in the Great Southern region for their strong commitment to delivering integrated and comprehensive health services to their local communities in conjunction with local service partners. The Board would like to thank Jan Cook and the dedicated Great Southern team for organising and hosting the Board meeting and engagements over the two day visit.
