The Board welcomed Ms Jennifer McGrath, Mental Health Commissioner, and received an update on the program of work underway by the Mental Health Commission, including the state-wide Ministerial Taskforce into Public Mental Health Services for Infants, Children and Adolescents aged 0-18 years. The WACHS Board acknowledges the leadership of Ms McGrath in advocating for country patients and addressing inequity in regional locations, and WACHS remains committed to continue collaborating with the Mental Health Commission to address any challenges.
