

# **BOARD COMMUNIQUÉ**

This communiqué highlights key discussions from the recent WA Country Health Service (WACHS) Board meeting.

## 25 February 2022

The first Board meeting of the year was held in Perth on Friday, 25 February 2022.

The Board welcomed the Australian Medical Association (AMA) WA President Dr Mark Duncan-Smith and Chief Executive Dr Bennie Ng. The AMA (WA) provided a presentation to the Board on their current issues of interest, and time was spent discussing how to collaboratively address challenges and focus on opportunities to progress issues in relation to the medical workforce.

A governance review has been commissioned by the Minister for Health to examine the operational and practical effectiveness of the governance structures set out in the *Health Services Act 2016* (WA) and their impact on patient outcomes, prior to the commencement of a statutory review required under the legislation. The Independent Governance Review (IGR) Panel, led by the Chair, Ms Kym Peake, also attended the meeting, and provided a summary overview of this review. The IGR advised the intent is to understand HSP perspectives and receive advice on areas for improvement within the current system, and determine whether the balance is right with current governance arrangements within the WA Health system.

The Board Finance, Audit and Risk, and Safety and Quality Committee Chairs also provided briefings to the Board on recent Committee meetings held in the month of February.
